An MTI Release. 30 min. 16mm \$520 Video \$470 Rental \$85 This sensitive documentary, produced and hosted by Collin Siedor, looks at America's single-most under-reported crime, examines its effects on the victims and probes the underlying causes behind these violent acts. Of great impact are candid interviews with victims of acquaintance rape and interviews with convicted rapists. Emphasizing the disparity of experience are women who, in pain and embarrassment, relate that even years after the crime, they still feel a constant sense of fear, are prone to recurrent depression and contemplate suicide. The men, in contrast, speak of women who "owe" them sexual favors after being taken to dinner, believe that the rape was a act of love, and insist that the more the woman resisted, the more they actually wanted to be taken. Confused by fear and inexperience, she feels that the incident may have even been her fault, that if she had just "given in" her boyfriend wouldn't be so upset with her - but she just isn't ready for sex. When some older friends discover her dilemma, she gets an important lesson in how to recognize and avoid date abuse. The program stresses the importance of communicating expectations and sexual limits and helps alleviate the fear of being rejected for standing up for personal rights. Moreover, it helps curtail date abuse by teaching young men that, despite the myth, "real" men don't abuse women and that there are serious consequences for such behavior.

CHILD MOLESTATION: BREAKING THE SILENCE, 20 min. 135F. Designed for viewing by anyone that supervises or spends time with children. Guidelines for identifying and reporting sexual abuse are given by using vignettes from "Now I Can Tell You My Secret".

IDENTIFYING, REPORTING, AND HANDLING DISCLOSURE OF THE SEXUALLY ABUSED CHILD, 25 min. 158V. This video, intended for professionals (teachers, day care workers, school nurses, and counselors) required by law to report suspected cases of abuse. It presents a series of dramatic vignette, which illustrate common behavioral indicators of child sexual abuse. It provides guidelines for legal and ethical reporting responsibilities, and models appropriate responses to a child's disclosure of sexual abuse.

LISTEN TO ME: PHYSICAL CHILD ABUSE, 15 min. 159V. There is no "simple" answer to what kind of parent beats his/her child. Even "nice" folk can cross the line between discipline and abuse. Physical abuse is not just a private family matter, but a social problem requiring intervention. This video explores the problem of physical abuse from a child's perspective, shows abuse can happen in any family, and "empowers" children shows witness abuse to seek help. SOMEBODY TOLD 20 min. 138V. This video about child abuse, shown through dramatized vignettes, is intended for viewing by volunteers, staff members, and board members, and is designed to help you

protect your organization and the youth you serve. Information given will help you develop a plan for dealing with incidents and accusations of child sexual abuse, with emphasis on prevention through preparation and planning. Child abuse is a cycle that can be broken when somebody tells.
