#### ABUSE PREVENTION **EDUCATION**

Educating individuals, families, pastors, teachers, and the community is the key to prevention of, and long-term recovery from abuse. WHEN has put a heavy emphasis on this very important aspect of our program. Each year we conduct the "Being There Conference" that provides a healing experience for men, women, and young adults who have been abused, are abusive or caregivers for individuals dealing with abuse issues. Our educational team conducts support groups, educational events and training programs on a national and international basis.

#### **CLEONE'S CLOSET FOOD** PANTRY (CCFP)



CCFP provides clothing, furniture, houseware, etc. for the community. Cleone's Closet partners with Amazon and

other organizations to give away other donated items to the community. Through the food pantry free food is distributed to the Airway Heights and surrounding communities. Food is donated by 2nd Harvest, Safeway, Yokes, Grocery Outlet, Starbucks, farmers, etc.




Staff members from Northwest Farm Credit Services volunteered to clean Cleone's Closet Food Pantry and gave a large donation to WHEN to support our programs and services.

Dear Ms. Dunbar,

It is a privilege and my honor you have allowed me to donate to Frieda's Healing Center. That is something that is vial to both girls, women as well as boys and men. Abuse must be eliminated through education, training and hard work for both victims and abusers. As you know most abusers were themselves abused or witnessed abuse in their formative years. That is why education, training and therapy is so important as well as kind, caring, loving safe places be available for both victims and abusers as well.

For victims they need as <u>safe place</u> away from their abusers and the abusers need a safe, <u>quiet place</u> to stop and reflect and realize the damage they have been doing. Victims need to be taught to say "No" and fight! Abusers need extensive therapy, education, and training so they understand <u>why</u> they do abusive behaviors and then learn new positive, alternative behaviors rather than tear down, a caring motion rather than striking out. They must learn to re-channel their feelings in a positive and productive way.

<u>Prison is not the answer!</u> Helping is. Helping <u>both</u>, separately to begin with, with the hope of reuniting the family, if possible if too much damage has not been done already. In 2023, if my VA benefits are increased by 8.7%, I will be sending you \$11.52 per month as along as I am able. Please feel free to use my ideas above and I hope we can stop abuse not matter where or when it may occur, and prevent it whenever possible. Thank you for your time, and Happy Holidays. -MBM






One of our volunteers dressed up like Santa Clause and distributed gifts to children. His identity will remain unknown.
