

WHAT IS YADDA?

YADDA (Youth Against Dating and Domestic Abuse) is a program of the Women's Healing and Empowerment Network (WHEN). WHEN provides opportunities for healing and empowerment to individuals, families, churches, schools, and other organizations through faith-based education, counseling, consultation, a healing center (safe house), resources (such as food and clothing), and other support services in the areas of domestic violence, sexual abuse, and related abuses.

WHEN pioneered the YADDA Scholarship Program in 2021 for the purpose of empowering abused lives and raising awareness in the up-and-coming generation of the problem of domestic violence and dating abuse in the Spokane community. The goals of YADDA are to:

- Help youth explore, understand and celebrate their value as a human being so that they can have and contribute to healthy interpersonal/community interaction.
- Provide opportunities for youth to understand the differences between healthy and toxic relationships.
- Help youth gain access to resources, and be empowered to take a proactive stance towards personal empowerment and abuse free living.
- Develop abuse prevention resources and programs for youth and young adults so that they can learn healthy relationship skills, thus preventing abusive dating, marital, etc. relationships.
- Encourage youth to take personal responsibility for making healthy choices to prevent the intergenerational cycle of domestic violence, sexual abuse, and related abuses.

- You are between the ages of 16-25.
- You are a resident of Spokane County.
- You have applied for or are attending a community college, university, or vocational school in Spokane County.
- You submit an essay, art project, story, poem, video, song, or skit or any other creative manner that answers the questions asked in the application.
- You can attend our Scholarship Awards Banquet on Sunday, May 18, 2024 at the Hillyard Baptist Church
- You send in your application by May 1, 2024
- You give us permission to post your picture and entry on our website, FB, newsletter to promote YADDA

The scholarship winners will be announced at the award's banquet on May 18, 2024.



Youth Against Dating and Domestic Abuse (YADDA) Scholarship Program

The Women's Healing and Empowerment Network (WHEN) will be awarding six scholarships to seniors in high school or Spokane County college students to help increase the awareness of domestic and dating violence in the community. Scholarships are as follows:

One **\$2,000** scholarships

Two **\$1,000** scholarship

One **\$500** scholarships

QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP:

- 1. Plan to enroll or be enrolled in a community college, four-year university, or vocational school either on a part-time or full-time basis.
- Be a resident of Spokane County.
- 3. Be a high school senior or college student age 16-30.
- 4. Complete the application and submit an essay, art project, story, poem, video, skit, song or creative project that answers the questions included in the application.
- 5. Submit two letters of recommendation: one from a teacher, professor, or mentor; and the other from a community or religious leader.
- 6. Participate in some form of community service over the past year

All applicants are required to attend the award's dinner on Sunday, May 18, from 4-6 pm in order to win unless you have a specific scheduled school-related conflict and can provide evidence of the schedule conflict).

This scholarship award program is open to all those who fit the qualifications above regardless of race, gender identity, religious affiliation, etc.

Applications must be received in their entirety by May 1, 2024.

APPLICATION REVIEW

Applications will be reviewed by a panel of judges and scholarships will be selected.

- Seventy-five (75) percent of the score will be based upon the entry,
- Twenty-five (25) percent will be based on the overall application (GPA, letters of recommendation, and college plans).

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

- Scholarships will be announced at the dinner on Saturday May 18, 2024, from 4-6 pm at the Hillyard Baptist Church.
- Applicants should be prepared to present their entry at the dinner (read the essay or story, sing the song, act the skit, introduce the video, or describe the artwork) if their work is selected.
- Scholarship recipients will be posted on the WHEN website and Facebook pages. Scholarships will be given directly to the educational institution that the recipient is/will be attending.
